Dimensions of Poverty - INCOME

As we continue to consider the different dimensions of poverty throughout the year. This month's theme is INCOME.

The north-east of Brazil is the lowest earning region of the country, but this is not matched with a lower cost of living.

50% of the population living in the northeast of Brazil are considered to be in poverty. Extreme poverty is considered as those with an income of less than \$2.15/day.

Most of our students come from households earning less than the minimum wage. Commonly, income is unsteady because it is informal and inconsistent.
